In a National Office chapel message, Bruce Lyman, director for Alliance ESL Ministries, put it this way: "Jesus was telling His followers that the harvest is plentiful, abundant, huge, great, vast, bigger than they could imagine. I love how all the different translations capture this passage. It gives us a fuller picture of what Jesus was saying—that there aren't enough people who can take in the harvest! He is asking you this: 'On your knees, beg, plead, for the Lord to send out workers into His harvest field."
